INTERNATIONAL INCE MINUTES OF THE 39th MEETING OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SUNDAY, 2013 SEPTEMBER 15 INNSBRUCK, AUSTRIA

1. **Opening**:

The 39th meeting of the General Assembly of the International Institute of Noise Control Engineers was opened at 13:05 on Sunday, 2013 September 15 by President J. Scheuren at the Hotel Grauer Bär Seminarraum 3, in Innsbruck Austria.

2. Roll Call: The roll call of the Member's Societies was conducted by response sheets.

3. Adoption of the Agenda:

The Secretary General gave a brief summary of the agenda of the meeting and noted several minor typographical errors in the draft Agenda. President Scheuren asked if there were any additional items for the agenda. Hearing none, the Agenda was finalized, approved and is appended as Attachment 1.

4. Approval of the minutes of the 38th Meeting held in New York, New York, USA, 2012 August 19:

President Scheuren asked for any comments or suggestions for the minutes of the 2012 General Assembly meeting. Hearing none, the minutes were approved as written.

5. Report of the President

President Scheuren reported on the current initiatives of the International Institute of Noise Control Engineering.

I-INCE is approaching its 40th anniversary. It serves as a federation of the acoustical and noise control engineering societies around the world. It has a significant role in providing leadership to the technical community particularly through the INTER-NOISE congress series and the I-INCE Symposia. During his term as President of I-INCE, President Scheuren will seek to increase the activity level of the Member Societies. Beginning this year, the I-INCE leadership plans to reassess our activities. We will be looking at several new initiatives including making an on-line database of all INTER-NOISE congress papers available to the members of Member Societies, contributing to an effort to create a documentary film about the effects of noise, identifying new Member Societies and reviewing and revising the I-INCE Vision, Mission, and Goals.

President Scheuren reported on the elections of Officers and members of the Board of Directors conducted the previous day at the Board of Directors meeting. The Officers and Directors of I-INCE for the year 2014 and their terms of office are listed in Attachment 8.

President Scheuren reported on INTER-NOISE series planning:

- INTER-NOISE 2014, will be held in Melbourne, Australia during the period 2014 November 16-19.
- INTER-NOISE 2015 will be held in San Francisco, CA, USA during the period 2015 August 9-12.
- INTER-NOISE 2016 will be held in Hamburg, Germany during the period 2016 August 21-24.

- For INTER-NOISE 2017, three informal proposals were reviewed by the Congress Selection Committee from the Asia-Pacific Region from Member Societies in South Korea, Hong Kong and Singapore. All three proposals have been invited to present formal proposals at next year's Congress Selection Committee.
- INTER-NOISE 2018 will be held in the Pan American Region. Informal proposals for INTER-NOISE 2018 will be reviewed in 2014 at the Congress Selection Committee meeting in Melbourne, Australia.

6. Report of the Secretary General:

The Secretary General reported that there have been two new member applications for member status with I-INCE. The organization Asociacion de Acusticos Argentinos (AdAA) has requested admission to Observer status. The VP Membership, S. Gerges, and the I-INCE Secretariat have received complete documentation of the legal status of AdAA and a description of its activities. The Board of Directors has reviewed the application and recommends approval of the application request. There were no questions. President Scheuren asked for a vote to admit AdAA to membership in I-INCE. The vote of the delegates present was unanimous in support of the application.

The VP Membership, S. Gerges, has also been in correspondence with Acoustical Society of Nigeria who has indicated a desire to be admitted to Observer status in I-INCE. The required documentation has not yet been received describing legal status and activities. However, the Board of Directors recommended to the General Assembly that Observer status be approved for the Nigerian society when those documents are received and have been judged to be complete. President Scheuren asked for comment related to the conditional approval of the request. Hearing none, the recommendation was accepted.

The Secretary General reported that there are currently no issues related to running the Secretariat. The University of Notre Dame has been highly supportive of hosting the Secretariat. He requested that the delegates assist with communications with the Member Societies.

7. Report of the Treasurer:

The Treasurer gave a report on the 2012 audited accounts. The information is shown in Attachment 2. The Treasurer showed the budget for the current year, 2013. The budget is shown in Attachment 3. The Treasurer reported on the 2014 Budget as approved by the Board of Directors. It is shown in Attachment 4. 2014 Member dues will remain the same as 2013 dues.

8. Membership of the Congress Selection Committee

President J. Scheuren reviewed the current membership of the Congress Selection Committee (CSC) as well as the terms that were expiring. Three terms expire at the end of 2013, B. Schulte-Fortkamp, S. Gerges and J. Cuschieri. Both B. Schulte-Fortkamp and S. Gerges have served on the CSC for more than 6 years. In keeping with new Rules that were proposed by the Board to the General Assembly, in the future, no member of the CSC will serve more than 6 years. A slate of candidates for the CSC was developed by the CSC Nominating Committee consisting of the President and Regional Vice-presidents. The slate consisted of J. Cuschieri, J. Yung and J. Patricio. The President asked for nominations. J. Thompson was nominated from the floor. The General

Assembly conducted a written ballot to elect three candidates from the slate of four nominees. J. Cuschieri and J. Yung were elected on the first ballot. A second written ballot was used to elect J. Patricio as the third newly elected member of the CSC.

9. Report on INTER-NOISE 2013, Innsbruck, Austria

Congress President W. Talasch gave a report on the status of INTER-NOISE 2013 as of September 15. He reported that there had been between 1265 registrants including 185 students. He reported that there had been 799 papers submitted which were organized into 12 parallel sessions. The exhibition included 53 vendors. 400 individuals had paid for banquet tickets. W. Talasch gave a brief overview of the budget and reported that the congress was likely to show a profit.

10. Report on INTER-NOISE 2014, Melbourne, Australia

M. Burgess gave a brief report on preparations for INTER-NOISE 2014 including congress venue, hotel accommodations, exhibition layout, timeline and plans for publicity. Detailed information is available at the congress website at www.internoise2014.com.

11. I-INCE Governance

W. Lang presented a proposed change to I-INCE Rules, Part 3, Congress Selection Committee that would limit service on the committee to two consecutive terms or six consecutive years. The proposed changes are appended as Attachment 5. The proposed change was approved without discussion.

12. Report of the Vice President for Technical Activities

Vice President for Technical Activities, R. Singh, reported on the technical activities of the I-INCE. His presentation is appended as Attachment 6. His report included progress summaries of Technical Study Groups, the Young Professional's Program, I-INCE Symposia, and the Future Congress Technical Planning (FCTP) meeting. In particular, R. Singh noted the actions of the Board of Directors to disband TSG1 with our gratitude for their efforts, authorize 5000 Euro support for an I-INCE Symposium to be held in San Francisco, and authorize 15 awards at 600 Euros each to support the Young Professionals program and 1000 Euros for the Young Professionals Workshop.

13. Report of the I-INCE Vice President for Communications

G. Maling, and others, reported on various topics related to I-INCE communications. He reported that a report had been prepared on the 2012 Motorcycle Noise Workshop. C. Burroughs gave a brief report about the Noise Control Engineering Journal, including that the journal had received 48 submissions to date toward its goal of 100 submissions for the year. J. Thompson gave the annual report about Noise News International. The presentation materials are included as Attachment 7. D. Manvell gave a status report on the Board activity to make all INTER-NOISE papers dating back to 1972 available on-line. The report resulted in discussion with the delegates who were generally supportive of the concept presented. D. Manvell projected that a final proposal would be available for member action within the next year.

14. General Assembly

J. Scheuren summarized his reflections on the role of the General Assembly as the incoming President of I-INCE. His intent is to encourage greater participation and contribution. He asked for suggestions and feedback from the delegates. Two items were raised; a better balloting process for election of CSC members and more distribution of information to active participants in I-INCE

activities.

15. Other Business

A. Brumme was invited to speak to the delegates about a film documentary project currently in development referred to as "In Pursuit of Silence". The documentary would be approximately 90 minutes in length. The production company is seeking financial support and is offering certain benefits to sponsors depending on the level of support. The delegates discussed the benefits of a widely distributed public production of a quieter world and the challenges of keeping the project focused on technical issues. The members of the Board of Directors present thanked the delegates for their input.

16. Next Meeting

The 2014 meeting of the General Assembly of I-INCE is tentatively planned for a location to be determined in Melbourne, Australia on 2014 November 16 from 13.00 – 15.30.

17. Close

The meeting was adjourned at 16.15 by President Scheuren.

Attachment 5 – Changes to I-INCE Rules, Part 3

RULES Part 3 – I-INCE CONGRESS SELECTION COMMITTEE: The latest version was approved by the General Assembly at its meeting on 2012 August 19. At the same meeting it was generally agreed to introduce a term limit of six years for those members of the CSC who are appointed by the General Assembly. Following the related request of the Board, it is recommended to change Article 3 of Part 3 to:

- Those members of the CSC who are appointed by the General Assembly shall serve for a period of three (3) years. Each three-year term shall terminate on a rotation schedule such that three (3) new members are appointed every year by the General Assembly.
- The terms of service for the members appointed by the General Assembly run from the meeting of the General Assembly in which appointment occurred until the subsequent meeting of the General Assembly three years later.
- The terms of service may be extended by another appointment for a second period of three years but may not exceed a total of six (6) years in sequence. After six subsequent years, new appointments are permissible only after a break of at least three years. The terms of service for the other members of the CSC shall coincide with their terms as officers of I-INCE.

- ✓ Number of countries represented in 4 years: Countries of Origin = 27 (Countries of Work = 25)
- ✓ Total money allocated by I-INCE= 51000 EUR in 6 years (in 6 years, from 2010 to 2015 for 96 grants)
- 10000 EUR (9000 EUR for Grants + 1000 EUR for the YP Workshop) allocated for INTER-NOISE 2014
- The Board has approved an increase in the grant from 500 EUR to 600 EUR (from 2015) and a reduction to 15 grants).
- Local organizers are expected to enhance these.


